Did you know?

NCMC is the second oldest community college in Missouri.

For 80 years, NCMC has been the premier provider of higher education and training to the citizens of our area. From a top floor in an existing public school building in 1925 to the current campus of over 14 buildings, NCMC continues to expand both its facilities and its curriculum.

Missouri community colleges receive only 16% of state appropriations for higher education; however, they generate more than 40% of the total credits (FTE).

The success rate of first-time, full-time degree seeking students at NCMC in 2002 was the highest percentage of all two-year public institutions in the state of Missouri.

Restoring Geyer Hall

North Central Missouri College seeks to restore the heart of the campus—Geyer Hall. In celebration of 80 years of instruction by the College and as a part of the aggressive campus development plan, a vision to both restore and renovate the landmark building of the College campus is in place. This proud structure built in 1918 has served as an elementary school, a junior high school and since 1967, the anchor building of Trenton Junior College . . . now NCMC. It is most important that Geyer Hall remain a key building in the College’s future and continue to serve as the center of academic instruction.

In an effort to preserve this landmark, the major gift campaign will focus on the restoration and renovation of Geyer Hall. The interior of the three-story building will be fully remodeled to address tomorrow’s technology. The library expansion will provide a place of comfort and offer a new ambiance with an atrium to the west of the building opening up to the College’s future academic campus. The exterior of the building will be carefully restored to its original character featuring window replacement and detailed brick enhancement.

As a part of the restoration of Geyer Hall and the construction of the new Allied Health and Life Sciences Building, the existing classrooms in Barnes and Freeman Halls will be relocated to the improved facilities, allowing for a twenty-first century learning environment.

Working hand in hand with new construction and restoration of Geyer Hall will be efforts to close a portion of Chestnut Street between both buildings. The street closure will allow for the necessary facility expansion, pedestrian safety, and the creation of a central core for the campus. Improved lighting, additional landscaping, and essential signage for this area will also be addressed with the funding from this initiative.

It is important that the campus of North Central Missouri College continue to develop. With the commitment of our extended community, this will become a reality when we **Invest in the Vision.**
