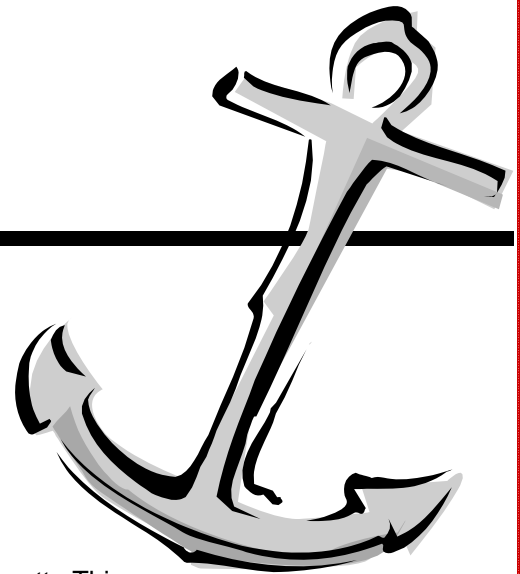

Bookstore Building Receives Attention

The NCMC bookstore building on Main Street received some much-needed attention last month when the outside staircase was removed. In picture #1, the separation of the staircase from the rest of the building can be clearly seen. In picture #2, personnel from Red Rock Demolition of Hamilton are shown taking down the addition. It came down very easily. The staircase accessed what was formerly an apartment over the bookstore. The rest of the building, which some may remember as Rex Studios, is structurally sound.

Many years ago this building housed the "Pirates Den Cafe," after NCMC purchased it in July 1988.

However, a feasibility study is currently underway by the college's architects to study the possibility of transitioning the bookstore to the current art building located on Crowder Road. According to college president Dr. Neil Nuttall, the art building could become an ideal bookstore, if it is determined that it would be cost-effective to add storage space and parking as well as remodel the inside of the building.

Monthly Board Meeting Report

At their April meeting, the NCMC Board of Trustees approved a policy manual change which will affect employee and non-employee tuition waivers. The most significant change requires those requesting a tuition waiver to apply other aid (federal and state grants, A+ funds, etc.) towards tuition cost *prior* to the awarding of an institutional waiver. Also at the Board meeting, the Board approved the employment of Dana Nelson of Trenton as the MOHealthWINS grant administrator. The MOHealthWINS initiative is part of a \$20 million grant to be shared by Missouri's community colleges to train an estimated 4,600 workers in the health services/health science industry. The grant was awarded by the U.S. Department of Labor. Ms. Nelson began her new position on April 30 and her office is located at the WIB office in downtown Trenton.

Steve Maxey, Director of Development, announced the receipt of an anonymous donation in the amount of \$25,000 to be used for student scholarships. Also, a gift is expected soon from the estate of the late Frederick Bosley, a member of the TJC/NCMC Distinguished Alumni Class of 2010.

The Board approved a lease of a small parcel of land at the Barton campus with Bluebird Communication in return for fiberoptic lines between the main campus and Barton campus. Other activity concerning the Barton campus was the purchase of a disc mower and a Snap-On Tools set.

The Board of Trustees will meet in special session on Thursday, May 17 with the NCMC Foundation Board of Directors at the Barton Campus. Their regular monthly meeting will be Tuesday, May 22, at 5:30 p.m.
