Disability Services

We seek to provide services and accommodations to students with disabilities by working closely with faculty and staff in an advisory capacity.

We will assist in the development of reasonable accommodations for students in order to provide equal access for "otherwise qualified" individuals with disabilities.

Qualified Individual (Sec 504)

- Have a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activity.
- Meets academic and technical standards requisite to admission or participation in the education program or activity.

Access to Academic Services

- Reasonable accommodations shall be made for eligible students with disabilities.
- Accommodations are provided to allow equal opportunity for students with disabilities.
- Requests that would alter the academic standards are not granted.
- Each student is given individual consideration.

Eligibility Verification

- Depends on the nature of the disability and its impact on learning.
- Identification of the nature and extent of the disability.
- Information on the functional limitation as related to the academic environment.
- Recommended reasonable accommodations.
- NOTE: Verification by another institution or organization does NOT guarantee eligibility at NCMC.

Student Responsibilities

- Identify themselves to the Disability Support Services Office.
- Provide appropriate documentation of disability.
- Make appointment with faculty as indicated in student handbook.
- Self monitor progress with faculty and meet college standards.
- Inform Disability Support Services of problems or changes to class schedule.

Confidentiality

- Disability documentation is confidential between the student and Disability Support Services except in emergencies.
- Any explicit or implicit inference to a particular student and the disability is inappropriate.
