

TRANSFER GUIDE for NORTH CENTRAL MISSOURI COLLEGE AD graduates in Nursing to COLUMBIA COLLEGE of Missouri's Bachelor of Science in Nursing

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the guide is to establish a seamless education plan for students completing the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) at North Central Missouri College, obtaining their RN license and transferring to the RN to BSN program at Columbia College. All Columbia College courses are offered online only. **Only grades of "C" or better will be accepted in transfer by Columbia College.** Student must enroll in the Associate to Bachelor's (A2B) Program for this plan. **NOTE:** Due to possible Columbia College catalog updates, always consult with your Columbia College Associate to Bachelors (A2B) advisor before making final course selections.


